## Principals Report - Ms. Amy Read

- Each late start the three middle schools meet - this month they focused on in class processes
- Focused on three - how do we increase on track for college by 3\%
- Increase reading scores by 3 as well as math scores

## Presidents Report - Shari Haug

- Each month we have been receiving, on average, about \$25
- Trying to come up with a fundraiser using swap.com - basically a large garage sale, the company would come and take all items anyone is willing to drop off and the PTA would get the proceeds from selling the items. Hawthorne is doing this in October, so we are going to wait and see what they think before we decide if Sandburg will participate
- We need a mascot - Churchville has a dog - so we are looking for someone to make a costume for our school (uncertain who would wear the costume, but Mr. Gail's name did come up or maybe a student)
- Mind benders competition between the three middle schools - would cover several different types of challenges - this would be a one time only event and not based on REACH only ( $\$ 100$ per school to do this) All three principals need to discuss before anything else happens with this idea
- October $9^{\text {th }}$ Meeting - Frank Dohlman will be discussing how do you get into REACH
- All grade tailgate parties are new this year - this Friday is the $8^{\text {th }}$ grade, Homecoming will be for the $7^{\text {th }}$ grade, and October $18^{\text {th }}$ will be for the $6^{\text {th }}$ grade
- Shari was quoted in an article from U.S. News - she shared this with us (article was about fundraising vs. fair share schools)


## Treasurer's Report - Kathleen Baer

- Budget was approved in August
- Last year was an extremely tight year but we have collected more fair share than budgeted this year, so we have added a few more programs to this year
- We should end the year flat
- Drive for Kids brought in \$1270
- We decided to use $\$ 100$ of this money for the mind benders challenge (if it happens) to cover this cost. Christine Juneman made the motion to move the funds and Kathleen Baer seconded this - the motion passed
- Each year the PTA gives each teacher \$25 to purchase items for their classrooms, this year we would like to use the money to purchase water filters for the drinking fountains on each floor so the students and teachers could fill water bottles from them - Amy is going to find out the cost for each filter


## Membership Report - Gina Orzak

- Membership is going well - we still have lots coming in
- this year we have made more money with fewer members than last year. This year more people have given additional dollars to the PTA on top of their fair share dues.
